Dear Fort Worth Wholesale Water Customer,

I'm pleased to announce that the Tarrant Regional Water District will lift Stage 1 drought measures on Monday, May 18<sup>th</sup>, 2014. Recent rains have put all lakes above capacity except for Lake Bridgeport. It continues to be 14 feet low but did rise 10 feet in one week. As you know, combined lake levels totaling 95 percent trigger an end to Stage 1 drought. However, there are no outdoor watering changes for our retail or wholesale customers. Please remember to contact the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality within 5 days of ending the drought restrictions for your community by filling out the "Public Water System Drought Contingency Plan Reporting Form" on their website.

In April 2014, Fort Worth City Council adopted maximum twice per week watering as a year round conservation measure. By contract, the communities that purchase treated water from Fort Worth are required to adopt the same measure. In addition, the prohibition, adopted in 2007, on watering any day between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. remains in effect.
